On behalf of ELUCO and the families we serve, thank you to everyone who so generously donated gift cards, gifts or food to our Christmas Share Program. So many individuals, both from our Marconi site and the community at large came forward to volunteer their services in organizing, wrapping and distributing hampers to our families. One of my greatest blessings was to witness the reaction of completely overwhelmed appreciative parents as they received their hampers. We were able to assist 70 families. Your generosity is a gift of

love and hope for our families that extends long after the Christmas season.

We are grateful to Richards Memorial United Church for the use of their bright open kitchen on Mondays during Lent for the ELUCO Cinnamon Buns fundraiser. Gently used children's items have generated income at First-St. Andrew's United Church's Family Love and Share Event in the fall and again at our **Rummage Sale April 25**th **2015** to bring the Growing Chefs to Marconi. Our 12-15 year olds are inspired by the contagious energy as professional chefs teach and share their love of cooking healthy choices. What an

awesome opportunity for our youth as they learn this valuable life skill, and sit down together to enjoy the fruits of their labour.

The students at Stoneybrook Public School have adopted our Marconi community students. What a wonderful outreach partnership. At Christmas time, each classroom adopted a child here providing gifts, making a card and beautifully wrapping the package to deliver to the home of one of our less fortunate children. They didn't stop there. A recent book drive brought a car load of books to the Marconi site for use in our programs and for distribution to families. Our children had so much fun during March break selecting their very own books to take home with them.

Not everyone takes a break during the March Break. Eight youth attended a full day session at the unit to develop babysitting knowledge and first aid skills for the Babysitter's Certificate

Program. All of our young leaders earned their certificate and are hoping to find some jobs providing childcare for families at our complex.

The highlight by far of March Break was our annual family trip to the Sugar Bush. It's hard to tell who has the most fun, the adults or children, but for sure it is just what the doctor ordered. Everyone forgets their problems and joins in on fun at the farm.

There's sausage and pancakes with fresh syrup to eat, a kitchen crammed with people in lively conversation, books and toys to occupy children waiting for others to finish their lunch, a playground and wide open spaces to run, several puddles and mud enticing little ones to wade in with toys, wandering in the woods with a bucket to collect sap, learning how to tap a tree and how the perfect syrup

is boiled, and of course the unanimous favourite activity for all-fast bumpy rides on the four wheeler. No one wanted to go home, and some had their hearts set on returning tomorrow. A huge thank you is extended to the many volunteers who made this trip possible and to Carol and Don Langford for the warm welcome at their farm.

Interning at ELUCO



It's hard to believe that my internship is almost over. It seems like just yesterday I was pulling into the parking lot at Marconi Blvd. and wondering what's next. I've learned a great deal working in the communities of ELUCO and met a lot of new people and heard a lot of stories.

When I tell people that my internship is split between two small rural churches and working at ELUCO the comment I usually hear is "Wow that must be so

different!" And I admit I thought it would be that way too but there are a lot of surprising similarities.

The Marconi community is a lot like the rural communities that I serve in because while they are a very diverse community they really are a tight knit community. They support each other and look out for each other. This was really noticeable in a recent Community Kitchen event. Seven ladies from the community pitched in together and produced 40 slow cooker meals for their families. The laughter, noise and friendship was wonderful to witness. It is also visible when you see the kids helping each other out and playing together. Beyond the people I also see similarities in the difficulties experienced in the ELUCO communities and in the rural communities. There are problems of poverty, hunger and health concerns everywhere not just in the east end of London. Interning at ELUCO has given me new tools and ideas that I can transfer to any community in which I work, though admittedly at a much different scale.

I have learned a great deal from ELUCO and can never repay this organization for all they have given me but I'll try! I will do my best to continue to support this organization by helping out whenever I can and certainly promoting the work of ELUCO everywhere I go.
